Warm Words from Pastor Shirley Oskamp

Dear Friends,

In Psalm 63:1, the writer cries out, "O God, you are my God, I seek you, my soul thirsts for you." Try saying this phrase over to yourself a few times. Let it sink in. O God, you are my God, I seek you, my soul thirsts for you. What does it feel like, when your soul truly thirsts for God, when your longing cannot be satisfied with anything less than God?

Longing is the theme of our first Advent at Night gathering at RUMC on Sunday, December 1st beginning at 5pm. The idea is that we will break bread together as we share what longing means to us, how longing shows up in our lives.

As we gather around the table with our bowls of soup, sharing in conversation and getting to know one another in a deeper way, the hope is that we will create and become the kind of community Jesus envisioned and the early church strove to be. I think many of us long for just this kind of relationship with God and with one another.

Belonging is the theme of our second gathering on December 8th. Many of us long for a place where we belong. We long for a place where we are accepted just as we are and where we are encouraged to become the very best we can be. Come share in the conversation and the soup, and help us create the community you long for, with Christ at the center, where compassion and care are the ties that bind us to one another in a deep communion of the Spirit.

Becoming is the theme for our third supper on December 15th. Who might you become, if you could live up to God's vision of you and your dreams for yourself? Who might you become, if you truly believed yourself to be a child of God? How might we become people who nurture the space in our hearts so that Christ can be born in us?

My vision for these Advent gatherings, and, actually, for our church in all that we do, is that we will create the kind of space we long for, a place where everyone who walks in the door knows that they are welcome, a place where they belong, and where each of us challenges ourselves to grow in faith and in love so that we become God's people right here and right now, doing the work of Christ together.

Angelus Silesius, a Franciscan priest, poet and mystic famously wrote, "Christ could be born a thousand times in Bethlehem – but all in vain until He is born in me." May all that we do to prepare for the birth of Christ in you and in me, and in this world that longs for God's touch.

We envision these gatherings as wonderful opportunities to invite friends and neighbors to come and dip a toe in the water of Christian fellowship.

<u>Blue Christmas</u> – Saturday, December 21st at 5:30 pm we gather at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church for a special service of remembrance. We come together to honor our grief and to seek out glimpses of light, in what can be a difficult time of the year for those of us who have experienced loss.

<u>Christmas Eve</u> – Tuesday, December 24th we gather for worship at 6:30 pm at RUMC with candlelight and carols, and the familiar, beloved tale of Jesus' birth.

Church of the Wildwood's Christmas Eve Service will be held at 8:30pm up in Chittenden, and you are welcome there if that timing works better for you.
